What is the professional value in volunteering?

For students, of any age, who are currently studying in the field of Human Services, or Child/Youth/Family and Community, there are many benefits if you choose to undertake local community volunteering. Employers like to see experience in the real world on your resume. Volunteering also helps you to develop a range of personal and professional skills which may highlight you as a valued employee.

Not all formal training or certification covers grief theory in depth, or offers practical application. There are limited opportunities at community level to work within the grief space and PKA provides an invaluable opportunity to observe and support families with their grief experience. With a children's program (ages 7–11 years); a teens program (ages 12–18 years); and a parent's support group, student volunteers can see if they prefer to work with children or adults.

LOCATIONS

Locations for our Programs vary depending on availability of the Venue/s. Currently our programs are held at the Crosslife Church building / Discovery Drive, Helensvale QLD, 4212. GENERAL VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

- 1. All volunteers must provide PKA administration with their best contact phone number and email and regularly check for communication, to stay informed with updates.
- 2. All volunteers must provide evidence of a current Working with Children blue card prior to being onsite for any face-to-face programs with children or teenagers.
- All volunteers are required to complete basic training and induction, either in a group or one to one, prior to taking on a buddy role.
- 4. All volunteers must read and familiarise themselves with relevant PKA policies.
- 5. Please inform your relevant Group Leader if you are a trained and current First Aider.

GENERAL COVID-19 REQUIREMENTS
